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Barriers

- Lack of legal rights
- Lack of experience and knowledge
- Paternalism
- Lack of acknowledgment of skills
- Continuity
- Youth and stakeholders in the same process
- Representation

What does *real* participation entail?

- Meaningful and relevant
- Knowledge and perspectives
- All issues of relevance
- Representativity
- Sustainability
- Connection between the one representing and those being represented





Possible solutions

- Universal agreement on the term "real participation"
- Changing laws, improving rights
- Recognize implications of art. 12 in CRC and similar conventions
- Economic support mechanisms
- Other support mechanisms
