



Enhancing Women's Participation Throughout the Electoral Cycle



E-learning Course







UNDP has developed a self-paced e-learning course on Enhancing Women's Political Participation throughout the Electoral Cycle that consists of six modules, covering the three phases of the electoral cycle, as well as of an introduction, a summary and a module dedicated to internal EMB structures and policies.



- After completing the course, the user will have a clearer understanding of the challenges women may experience during the electoral cycle in their roles as voters, candidates and electoral administrators.
- The course highlights entry points to boost women's participation in different roles and phases of the electoral cycle.
- The user will be provided with a detailed overview of the existing policy and human rights framework, relevant publications and other knowledge tools, given examples of gender policies and strategies, introduced to quota and other Temporary Special Measures, as well as provided with recommendations on how to design gender sensitive civic and voter education campaigns and how to mainstream gender considerations into electoral operations.
- Participants receive a certificate after completing the final exam at the end of the course.





The e-learning complements UNDP's publications on gender and elections and is part of the larger efforts of UNDP's Global Project for Electoral Cycle Support (GPECS) to strengthen women's political participation as voters, candidates and electoral administrators.

The target group of the e-learning are men and women working in electoral administration, candidates, political party members, but also assistance providers and members of civil society organizations.
